SEEDLING TREE PROGRAM

To request a windbreak consultation or get information on purchasing seedling trees, visit lccdnet.org

Since 2020, LCCD has sold **188,299 seedling trees** for establishing conservation tree plantings (shelterbelts, field/livestock windbreaks, living snow fences, wildlife habitat areas); installed **108 miles** of tree rows to control blowing snow and buffer the Wyoming wind; and conducted **1,014 on-site tree visits** to address insect control, disease management, and overall tree health for Laramie County residents.



COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT PROJECTS

Do you have an idea to improve our county's natural resources, environment, or natural beauty? Submit a proposal at lccdnet.org; we offer up to \$1K in funds to assist in implementing approved projects!

Since 2020, **\$180,871** has gone toward projects designed to improve our county's natural resources, environment, and natural beauty, including providing seedling Ponderosa pine evergreen trees to **every 2nd grader in Laramie County** and providing landowners with **native wildflower pollinator seed mix** to plant on leach fields.



LIVING SNOW FENCE PROGRAM

This program is funded by WYDOT and Laramie County Public Works.

In the **36 years** since this program began, completed living snow fence projects have protected over **35 miles** of high-priority public roads in Laramie County from blowing snow.

Additionally, funds have allowed us to plant **3,761 trees**—equivalent to **4.2 miles of tree rows**—and assist in continuing long-term maintenance of these projects.



PUBLIC OUTREACH

At LCCD, we love opportunities to present on natural resources. To have our booth at your community event, call (307) 772-2600.

Over the past four years, we've provided natural resource education to **3,077 Laramie County students** and supported Rooted in Cheyenne in planting **820 street trees**.



WATER PROGRAM

To get free technical assistance for water quality enhancement projects—including stream restoration and water development for livestock/wildlife—call (307) 772-2600.

Particularly impactful projects over the past four years include multiple water-wise plantings, including the **Laramie County Library detention pond conversion**; construction of a **new warm-water fishery and wetland complex** in Cheyenne; Dry Creek reconstruction within town to improve habitat and flood-plain connectivity and reduce erosion; protecting multiple species of concern with improved riparian cattle management on **4.2 miles of Lodgepole Creek**; and improving riparian habitat and aquifer recharge over **1 mile of Crow Creek** on public lands.



WILDLIFE & RANGE PROGRAM

For assistance with grazing management, weed management, seeding recommendations, or wildlife habitat management, call (307) 772-2600.

With help from mill levy funds, we've made **313 recommendations** for weed, seed and pasture management; completed **33 "small water projects"** to improve wildlife conditions and livestock management; monitored and sprayed **13,200 acres** with a helicopter to help control cheatgrass in Curt Gowdy State Park and Medicine Bow-Rout National Forest; and **assisted over 77 residents** in identifying proper acreage and pasture management.
